Victoria Saxby is spending a year living and working at Casa Reom in Beira. Here is her latest report for Casa Reom News:

“As I write this I have been in Beira for 5 weeks. I have been enjoying nearly every aspect of my time here so far. The boys gave me a lovely welcome when I first went to Inhamizua and several of them commented on how we had spoken on the phone when I was in England.



We looked at their day, and tried to make plans to make the day more activity driven rather than doing as they pleased. This is taking time to get going, and with the school holidays due to start during November and December we will need to adjust again.

I think for the boys the best bit of the day is that we have included a morning and afternoon snack time with fruit in the morning and biscuits in the afternoon. This obviously costs us more money, so I just pray we can continue with this. I spend most of my time at Inhamizua with the boys, however I have visited Dondo a few times since being here.
